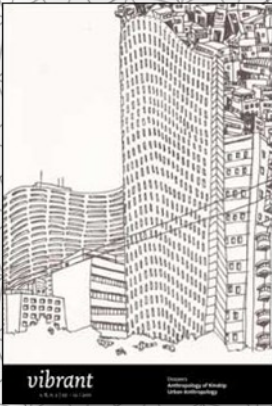

VIBRANT – Virtual Brazilian Anthropology was conceived by the Brazilian Anthropological Association (ABA) as a medium for disseminating Brazilian anthropology beyond the Portuguese-speaking world. The presentation in English, French and Spanish of articles and audiovisual materials produced by anthropologists working in Brazil is intended, therefore, to promote greater transnational interchange of ideas and to further awareness of the diversity within anthropology. The journal of the Brazilian Anthropology Association, aims to disseminate knowledge of Brazilian Anthropology around the world, publishing articles in English, French and Spanish.

ABA is the longest established scientific association in Brazil in the area of social sciences and is the only scientific society that congregates anthropologists in the country. Founded in 1955, the association holds a prominent role in the dissemination of anthropological research in Brazil, in the conduct of issues related to human rights public policies and in the improvement of the scientific and educational systems of the country.

ABA has played a fundamental role in the defense of ethnic groups as well as in the struggle for the demarcation of indigenous lands and the regularization of territories occupied by groups of African descent. It has been active in the recognition of minority rights and the preservation of cultural heritage in several historical moments of the country.
